The Interpretive center at Frank Slide had just reopened after being newly renovated and the tour guide was very informative and helped disspell some of the misconceptions & stories that have been told over the years. Imagine on Apr 29, 1903 at 4:10am, 30 million cubic metres of limestone crashed

from the summit of Turtle Mtn and buried part of the sleeping town of Frank. The rock mass that fell was 500 ft deep, 1,400 ft high and one kilometre wide. In a town of approx 600 people, only around 100 individuals were killed. All this happened in only 90 seconds.



On the way back from Frank Slide, we stopped to enjoy the Lundebeck Falls. Then it was onto to Claresholm for a short break, which was supposed to be just to stretch our legs, but turned into an ice cream break.

RECIPE CORNER

Recipe from Zita Cloney #784 Cold Lake (Alberta AGM in April/09).

Graham Squares


Filling – Melt together over low heat - 1 cup brown sugar and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup margarine. Beat well $\frac{1}{3}$ cup milk and 1 egg and add to the melted sugar and margarine. Cook on medium heat until thick. Remove from heat and cool for a few minutes. Then add 1 cup of coconut and 1 cup of graham crumbs.

Put graham crackers in bottom of a pan dish and then add your filling. Top with another layer of graham crackers. Add your icing.

Icing $-1\frac{1}{2}$ cups of icing sugar, 1 egg, pinch of salt, 1 tsp vanilla, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup margarine and beat for 3 minutes.

GETTING TO KNOW YOU.....



Allen Robert Collins

Being a farm boy in drought ridden southern Alberta in the late 1920's and early 1930's, Allen had seen enough of farming. When war was declared in 1939 at 19 years old, along with his pal, he joined the RCAF in Calgary. Never being more than 100 miles from home, this was an experience in itself.



From Manning depot in Edmonton his whole troop was posted to #15

SFTS Claresholm. To his knowledge no one from his Claresholm troop made aircrew. In October, Allen was posted to #1 Northwest Staging Unit Grande Prairie, Alberta. These units were emergency stopping points for aircraft being "ferried" to Alaska for futherance to Russia and beyond. Many never knew about the Staging Units and their functions. There was also a US Airforce Unit at the base.

He was married in Grande Prairie in 1944 and then in the fall of 1945 was posted to Winnipeg until his release in January 1946. He then returned to Grande Prairie to look for work. He has lived in Grande Prairie, Dawson Creek, Athabasca, and Edmonton finally locating to Calgary in 1962. Most of his working years until 1984 was with a heavy equipment company.

Since his retirement, he has become involved with genelogy where he discovered he was a descendant of Wm. Bradford (1620 Mayflower passenger) and now is a member of the Canadian and US Mayflower Society. On his maternal side, he is the grandson of Wm. F. Parker, who arrived in Ft. Macleod in 1874 with the first contingent of the newly formed N.W.M.P. As a footnote, he was born 9 pm on Mar 27,1924 in Burdett, Alberta, which makes him 3 hours and 4 days <u>older</u> than the RACF (Apr 2, 1924). He knows this exact time via his mother's diary which she "kept" faithfully from 1923 into the early 1940's.

"Looking back, I have enjoyed my life with really no regrets. I have enjoyed life with these former RCAF'ers here in Calgary."
