Les Brockelsby, a member of the #783 Wing, passed away on April 30, 2011. Our sympathy and condolences to his family during this time of loss.

LESLIE 'LES' GEORGE BROCKELSBY December 8, 1923 - April 30, 2011 Leslie "Les" George Brockelsby of Calgary passed away peacefully in his sleep on Saturday, April 30, 2011 at the age of 87 years. His zest for life will be

remembered by all who knew him. He lived life to its fullest and when

he took on a project it was always full speed ahead. Les had many interests including Scouting, to which he committed himself for twenty-four years. He also had a passion for magic from a very young age, performing his first magic show at age seven as 'The Wonder Boy of Plymouth'. Once retired, his interest in magic returned when he helped organize a local magic club, Calgary Magic Circle - Ring 66 which is now known as the 'Les Brockelsby Ring'. Les spent much of his time mentoring aspiring young magicians. His crowning achievement would be the raising of six children together with Rosemary, his wife of fifty-eight years, who predeceased him in 2003. The Brockelsby residence was always a welcome home for friends of their children who came to call Les and Rosemary 'Mr. and Mrs. B'. He was very proud of his children and grandchildren. He will be greatly missed by his children David, Gerry, Gay, Tim, Nancy and Susan and his grandchildren Ryan, Shawna, Scott, Geoff, Jennie, Taylor, Lawren and Kate; and a wide circle of friends in Toronto and Calgary.

RECIPE SWAP



Food Recipes

Submitted by Ethel Fleming

Salad Dressing

1 cup of Milk 1/2 cup of Sugar 1/2 cup of Water 2 Tbsp Flour

1/2 cup of Vinegar 1 1/2 Tsp. Mustard Powder 2 Eggs add Salt to your taste

Combine and mix in a blender. Can be cooked in a double boiler or microwave ... heat until thick. Add 3 Tbsp of Butter, when it has melted. put into a clean sterilized quart jar. Store in the refrigerator after it cools.

Orange Honey Dressing

3/4 cup of Miracle Whip
1/8 cup Orange juice
1/8 cup of Honey
1 Tbsp grated orange rind

Serve over romaine lettuce, mandarin orange sections and top with toasted almonds.

Serves 4.

Summer Drink

4 cups of water 3 cups of Sugar Juice from 2 Lemons & Juice for 2 Oranges

Wash the fruit and grate the rind off of both the Lemons and the Oranges; add this to the liquid. Add 1 oz of Citric Acid (available at the Drug Store.) Bring the mixture to a rolling boil. Let the mixture sit over night, strain. Use this as syrup to your taste in ice cold water. Store in refrigerator.

Cool Rhubarb Punch (a guaranteed crowd pleaser)

Basic ingredient; 4 lbs of Rhubarb Choose good (red) color; wash and cut into small pieces Cover with water and cook until the fruit falls apart. Strain through a jelly bag. **Hint:** can be prepared and frozen while rhubarb is in season, and can be used as an excellent punch at Christmas; or used right away. When ready to use add the following:

1 6 oz can of frozen Orange Juice 1 6 oz can of frozen Lemon Juice

Add all ingredients to a large punch bowl the fill the bowl until full with bottles of either: Sprite, 7up, Ginger ale etc. A syrup of sugar and water (previously boiled and cooled) can be added to your taste, but most times the pop is sufficient to sweeten the mixture.

<u>Christmas idea</u>: Freeze Sprite, 7up etc in a bunt of other tube type cake pan. Add Red and Green cherries. Remove this from the pan and place the ring into the punch bowl. It will cool your punch, look Christmasee and not dilute your punch.

Steve MacDonnell, P.Eng

Steve MacDonnell is a native of Sydney, Nova Scotia. A descendent of Highland Scots given an exit visa after Culloden Moor, he is equally as proud of his French Canadian roots dating back to 1648 at Port Royal, NS. As a youth he was involved in music, the scouting program and was a graduate of the Royal Canadian Air Cadet program. His father, a veteran of the RCA in WWII, gave his sons a choice about cadets. That choice was sea, land



or air. Steve attained his power flight wings, skydiving certification (the League and CF then looked the other way from these local training initiatives), and the position of squadron warrant officer with 693 "Rotary" Squadron. His time in cadets culminated with an exchange tour to the UK. He was a member of a local band called the "Push Rods"- we all rebuilt old V-8s in those days. The band performed popular, light rock and a sort of Celtic flair before others actually made money at it. Steve was found behind the keyboards or on the bass guitar.

While still in High School and a member of 693, he also joined the local field engineering squadron (militia) and remembers the trips to the outdoor range in the winter in the back of the old "deuce and a half" singing "Drink rum, drink rum, drink rum, drink rum and come along with us"! Using money from the militia, the band and some shifts at Zeller's he managed to upgrade his pilot's license to commercial with a FI rating at the old Eastern Flying Services. He did a brief one year stint in the CIL as Training Officer at 693. After moving to Halifax to attend Dalhousie University, he transferred back to primary reserve and served at CFB Shearwater. It was there where he found an early copy of "Airforce" magazine, nabbed the MAL card insert and joined the RCAF Association. He also volunteered as a ground school instructor with 615 "Bluenose" Squadron in Halifax and flew tow planes with the NS Gliding Zone never forgetting the lessons learned in landing a tail dragger (L-19) in cross winds. Over the years he was also a co-owner of both a C-185 and a Piper Senaca. Steve returned to uniform much later with 538 "Buffalo" Squadron, Calgary, serving from 1991 to 1996, the last three years as commanding officer. Following his time with 538 Squadron he transferred to the Canadian Forces

Getting on with real life, Steve graduated with a B.Sc. in Physics from Dalhousie and subsequently a B.Eng and M.Eng. in Civil and Environmental Engineering respectively from the then Technical University of Nova Scotia (now part of Dal). He is also a graduate of the University of Calgary in management, the Banff Centre in leadership and holds a Certificate in Risk Management from McGill. Registered as a professional engineer in 1983, he has held technical and management positions in the natural resources and energy industries. He has worked on and led both domestic and international projects. He has also served on design code committees with the Canadian Council of Ministers of the Environment and the Canadian Standards Association.

Steve actually began his professional career in Halifax as a project engineer with Acres International Ltd. A brief posting to a resident engineering position in Argentina was followed by a transfer to Calgary. He later joined Shell Canada Limited working on projects for Shell and its subsidiaries throughout the country. He founded Shieling Technologies with two partners in 1991 providing consulting services in environmental engineering and risk management to national and international clients. He was recruited by the Gemini Corporation of Calgary in 1997 into a senior project management role. Steve is a principal engineer with Gemini and also serves as a project advisor.

He is a former executive member of the Dalhousie University Alumni Association, volunteer in the mentoring program of the Association of Professional Engineers, Geologists and Geophysicists of Alberta, volunteer with the Canadian Cancer Society and is a member of several professional, service, military and community and aviation organizations including the Canadian Owners' and Pilots' Association, the Royal Alberta United Services Institute, Royal Canadian Legion and the Air Force Association of Canada. He is a Past President of both 783 (Calgary) Wing and Alberta Group. He also served the association on its National Executive Council. Steve was highly honoured to receive the Meritorious Service Award from the association in 2009. He promotes the air force, air cadets and aviation wherever he can in his business and community involvement.

Although expensive, Steve still enjoys getting into the air as often as possible. In his down time, which is usually vacation time, he enjoys skiing, sailing, kayaking, history and music. His favourite author is Jack Higgins, his favourite actor is Michael Caine, his favourite actress is Meg Ryan, his favourite music is, well, "all music", and his favourite movie is still "Planes, Trains and Automobiles". CWO Helen Wheeler was born in Shelburne, Nova Scotia. She enrolled in the Canadian Forces on 8 October 1981. Upon completion of recruit training in Cornwallis, Nova Scotia she has enjoyed a wide variety of postings in the Administration and RMS Occupations such as CFSAL Borden, CFSCE Kingston, Canadian Forces Station Barrington, NDHQ Ottawa with the Chief of Staff for Operations J3 followed by the Directorate of Protocol and Foreign Liaison, then off to the 1-year

French language course. Shortly thereafter she joined the Chief of the Air Staff's Executive team for three years followed by two years with the Air Command CWO as his Executive Assistant. Although her career profile had been diverse to this point, it was time to reunite with her Bluenose roots in 2002, this time with the Navy at MARLANT Headquarters for one year and then with the Army at Land Force Atlantic Area Headquarters for 4 years which included a deployment to Bosnia, Herzegovina.
