May 5th will mark the third anniversary of the Air Force Museum with the 100th anniversary of the Royal Flying Corps and a few new displays. Grant mentioned the visit to the museum of Vice Admiral Madison and how Edith McMinn showed him her display and how he was impressed and will return.



| 3 CUPS COOKED SHREDDED CHICKEN | 750 | mLZ |
|--|-----|-----|
| I CUP GRATED CHEDDAR CHEESE | 250 | mL |
| 1/2 CUP SLICED GREEN ONIONS | 125 | mL |
| 2 CUPS FAT-FREE SOUR CREAM | 500 | mL |
| 4 OZ. CAN DICED GREEN CHILIES, DRAINED | 1/3 | mL |
| 3/4 TSP. CUMIN | | mL |
| 12 OZ. JAR SALSA, MEDIUM HEAT | 341 | mL |
| 8, 8" (20 cm) FLOUR TORTILLAS | | |
| 1/2 CUP GRATED CHEDDAR CHEESE | 125 | mL |

PREHEAT OVEN TO 400°F (200°C). IN LARGE BOWL STIR TOGETHER CHICKEN, CHEESE, GREEN ONIONS, SOUR CREAM, CHILIES AND CUMIN. POUR I CUP (250 mL) SALSA INTO A 10" (25 cm) PIE PLATE. OTHER NEWS

British Consulate-General Office opens in Calgary



The British High Commission has announced the opening of a British Consulate-General office in Calgary. The announcement was made by British Prime Minister David Cameron last September and the new Consul-General took up his duties as of June 25th, 2012.

This upgrade from the former Trade and Investment Office to Consulate-General is indicative of the deep and enduring relationship between the U.K. and Canada, and will serve to strengthen business ties between the two nations.



The new Consulate-General is Mr. Tony Kay, who will reside in Calgary. "Being the first Consul-General in Calgary is a huge privilege" he said. Mr. Kay's previous posting was as the U.K.'s Consular Regional Director for the Middle East, based in Oman since 2009.

Mr. Kay has been formally invited to attend the Wing's Battle of Britain Parade on September 16th, 2012 at The Military

Museums and to lay a wreath on behalf of the British High Commission. He has not yet formally accepted the invitation.

Former 781 Air Cadet Graduates RMC with First Class Distinction

Jared Michael Gordon, son of Thom and Lorie Gordon is shown being awarded an Aeronautical



Engineering Degree with First Class Distinction by Rt Hon Peter Mackay, Canada's Minister of Defence at the 2012 Graduation Ceremony at RMC Kingston Ontario on May 17, 2012. The Royal Military College Graduating Class of 2012 had the distinction of being the largest one to ever graduate from that institution.

Jared was a former 781 Air Cadet who obtained both his Glider and Power pilot licenses through the program. He also distinguished himself as an accomplished Piper with the 781 Pipe Band, continuing to help lead the RMC Pipe Band as well. He continues his Aeronautical Engineering training with the Royal Canadian Air Force in Borden and will be working with Canada's Fighter Jets.

July 7, 1012 – Salute to the Warren Twins Bomber Command Museum of Canada

Identical twins Bruce and Douglas Warren were born in Nanton in 1922. Joining the Royal Canadian Air Force at age 18, they completed their elementary flying training at #5 EFTS at High River. During this training they often flew over their hometown of Nanton.

As part of No. 165 Squadron they flew Spitfire fighters on three sorties in support of the Canadian Army at Dieppe, sharing in the destruction of a DO217 bomber.

During 1944, the twins served as Spitfire pilots with No. 66 Squadron where Bruce was "A"

Flight Commander and Douglas was "B" Flight Commander. They both had the nickname "Duke" and were known a "Duke Mk I" and "Duke Mk 11." Having identical twins as flight commanders on the same squadron was a unique situation. The majority of the pilots could not tell the twins apart but this was no problem as they assumed whoever was giving them orders knew which flight they were commanding.



Their former CO recalled, "As pilots they had the right mixture of determination, discretion, and dash to be successful an formidable...They both had inquiring minds and little patience with tradition-bound methods or ways of though. . . They represented the new world at its best. And each, with a impartiality and detachment which was sometimes puzzling, called the other "Duke."

In March, 1945 the identical twins were awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross by King George VI, who remarked, "I don't believe I have ever done this before."
