Coleen (Ayers) Cook Oct 24, 1932—May 24, 2022

It is with deep sorrow and much love that we mourn the passing of our mother and grand-mother, Maybelle Coleen (Ayers) Cook of Calgary, Alberta who joined her parents, brothers and sisters on May 24, 2022. Coleen was born in Demaine, Saskatchewan on October 24, 1932 and was raised on the family farm near Lucky Lake, Saskatchewan. She passed away at the age of 89 at the South Health Campus Hospital in Calgary, Alberta.

Coleen was a proud, loving and caring mother, grandmother, great grandmother and aunt. She will be remembered with love and affection by her husband of 67 years, Bill Cook; her son Howard and daughter-in-law Valerie; daughter Susan and son-in-law Brian; grandchildren: Tamara, Alexis, Shalyn and Lucas; and great grandchildren: Tayla, Aiden and Ryker as well as her many nieces and nephews.

Coleen was the youngest of ten brothers and sisters who she loved dearly. She was the glue of her family and made sure to be in contact with every one of her sisters, brothers, nieces and nephews as much as possible. She loved the history of her family, visiting and sharing stories and genuinely felt the deep connection that family brings.

Coleen met Bill while living and working in her first job as a nurse at the Fort Qu'Appelle Hospital. Bill was an insurance agent and traveled around the province. He had met Loretta (Coleen's sister) and Norm in his travels. Knowing that Bill would be traveling one weekend to Midale, Loretta asked him to bring Coleen along as she had the weekend off. The two began dating and married in December 1954.

Coleen believed that women had to be ever ready to take care of themselves and their families. She started her work life as a bank teller in Regina, Saskatchewan as a young woman then went into nursing school at the Regina Grey Nuns Hospital, graduating in 1954. She was a member of the Regina Grey Nuns Nurses Alumni and attended many of their yearly Alumni Reunions. She went on to spend the rest of her career working in hospitals and later, until her retirement, in the Dalbrent Doctors' Office. She had a shining career, and in the 1970's when her family moved to Calgary she was hired at the Foothills Hospital and helped open the new Burn Ward as assistant head nurse.

Coleen will be missed by her family and many friends, and will be cherished forever.

A Graveside Service will take place at Mountain View Memorial Gardens Cemetery (1605 100 Street SE, Calgary) for the internment of her remains on Friday, September 16, 2022 at 3:00 p.m. We will be celebrating Coleen's life at a backyard family BBQ on September 17, 2022 at the home of her son and daughter-in-law, Howard and Val. WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH Ms. Joanna Howard - Alberta Volunteer Extraordinaire

Joanna has been supporting the Air Cadet movement in Alberta for 42 years. Like many, she joined when her eldest son joined 781 Squadron as a Cadet, but unlike her Cadets, she has yet to leave! Within weeks of becoming an SSC volunteer, the Treasurer resigned, and she put up her hand and became Treasurer. This was the "old days" according to her, and the work she did was in a ledger book and all paper and pencil. Joanna's "Cadet" career went on from there, never saying no to an ask that she could fulfill. After working for several years at the Squadron level, she joined the provincial committee in various roles including Wing Director and as Vice Chair. After retiring from Wing Director, she was Squadron advisor for 52, 538, 781, 187 and 903 Squadrons. She returned to the role as Southern Wing Di-



rector for another "stint" when the role could not be filled in the 200's, and she continues to hold the role of Assistant South Wing Director, doing any job the current Director throws her way.

Although she has 100's or more very proud moments, Joanna was instrumental in "standing up" 903 Squadron in Strathmore Alberta as a founding member. She has been extremely active in preparing Cadets for scholarship boards and many Cadets have benefited from her encouragement and knowledge. Her expertise led her to being on the IACE interview committee for decades.

Although never a Cadet herself, she has seen how well so many Cadets have turned into responsible and well adjusted adults, including her own two children and so many others.

Joanna "bleeds" Cadets and her license plate is "AIRCDTS". She promotes the program at every opportunity and loves sharing the story that she was in her car in a store parking lot one day and a former Cadet who she had worked with tapped on her window, came to attention and saluted her and thanked her for everything she had done for his success.
